The El Paso County Junior Livestock Sale Committee is once again partnering with StockShowAuctions.com to provide for online auction style bidding in conjunction and simultaneous with the live 2025 Junior Livestock Sale. The partnership allows Buyers the option of attending the Sale in person or the flexibility to view and bid online using a computer or mobile device from any location in the country. In addition, the Online Platform provides educational features intended to assist exhibitors with marketing their projects and driving additional financial benefit from supporters. We hope early access to the Sale Catalog will assist you in evaluating your selections and planning your day.

Buyer registration will occur in **Owens Livestock Arena**. Buyer numbers and BBQ tickets will be provided at the registration table. The Buyer BBQ will be held in the privacy of Swink Hall, which is located on the north side of the fairground complex, from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., prior to the Sale.

Pre-sale activities, including the recognition of scholarship recipients and award presentations, will begin in Owens Livestock Arena at 12:30 p.m.

The live auction for bidding on and purchasing animals will begin at 1:00 MST on Saturday, July 19, 2025, in Owens Arena at the El Paso County Fair and Event Center, located at 366 10th Street, in Calhan, Colorado. The Sale will begin with the Sale of Champions, followed by rotating rounds of each species. You can bid online at <https://www.stockshowauctions.com/>. In addition, phone or proxy bidding arrangements can be made by contacting the Sale Manager at the phone number or email listed on the front page of this catalog.

MEANINGFUL WAYS TO PARTICIPATE

CUSTOM HARVEST

Experience the farm-to-table connection firsthand. Buyers choosing custom harvest pay the full bid price and select from a list of local processors. The Livestock Committee delivers the animal, and the buyer coordinates with the processor for specific cutting and packaging instructions. Buyers are responsible for processing fees and meat pickup. This option gives families and businesses the opportunity to stock their freezers with high-quality, locally raised meat—and know exactly where their food comes from.

The example provided below is for illustration and estimation purposes only based on the purchase of a market beef.

FORMULA:

Buyer's Bid Price (Full Price)
(+) Processing Cost
(x) Carcass Weight
(=) Total Freezer Price to Buyer

EXAMPLE:

1,300 lb. Steer @ Bid Price of:	\$5,000
(+) Processing (\$1.40/LB x 815 lbs. + Harvest Charge \$130):	<u>\$1,271</u>
(=) Total Freezer Price:	\$6,271

(Total cost of 6,271 divided by Hanging Weight of 815 lbs. = \$7.69 per pound for all cuts of meat)

DONATION TO SPRINGS RESCUE MISSION

You can support both the youth and community members in need by choosing to contribute to the success of our strategic partnership with Protein for Helping Others (P4HO) and the Springs Rescue Mission. Buyers pay the full bid price, and the animal is harvested and donated to Springs Rescue Mission. In 2024, more than 53 animals were donated through this partnership, resulting in over 5,500 pounds of healthy protein for individuals experiencing food insecurity. The meat is also used in the Mission's culinary training program, equipping participants with valuable job skills. This act of generosity can have a lasting, life-changing impact.

BUYBACK OPTION

For those who want to support youth without taking possession of the animal, the Buyback option allows buyers to pay only the difference between the sale price and the market (floor) price. A designated buyback buyer, such as P4HO, pays the buyback (market floor price) to the Sale Committee and no further action is needed by the buyer. It is a low-commitment way to make a big difference.

ADD-ONS

For those who want to support local youth but are not looking to purchase an animal, the Add-On option offers a meaningful way to contribute. Add-Ons are direct financial donations made to individual 4-H and FFA exhibitors, with no animal purchase required. Add-On contributions will be accepted online at [StockShowAuctions.com](https://www.epcirlivestocksale.com) beginning at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 19, and will remain open through 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, July 22nd. The minimum Add-On amount per exhibitor is \$30. Every dollar goes directly to the exhibitor and helps fund future agricultural and educational endeavors.

Buyers may also qualify for tax deductions depending on the option chosen. Additionally, contributions made through Protein 4 Helping Others (P4HO) and the Springs Rescue Mission, both registered nonprofit organizations, may also be tax-deductible. Buyers should consult their tax professionals to determine eligibility and maximize their community investment.

GOATS, RABBITS, POULTRY, SWINE, SHEEP, and BEEF will be offered as TERMINAL ONLY. All animals will be offered for sale and will transfer ownership to the highest paying bidder.

Payment for purchases can be made by personal/business check, cash, debit or credit card at any time during the Sale or at the conclusion thereof. Buyers of multiple animals will be given a summary and a combined total of their purchases. There will be a 3.9% convenience fee assessed on debit/credit card payments.

In addition, electronic invoices will be emailed at the conclusion of the Add-On portion of the Sale on Tuesday, July 22, 2025.
