Pre-sale activities, which include the recognition of the 2021 scholarships recipients and award presentations, will begin in Owens Livestock Arena at 12:30 p.m.

WAYS TO PARTICIATE IN THE EL PASO COUNTY JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SALE

The following information provides information regarding the Terms of the El Paso County Junior Livestock Sale and how you can support the 4-H and FFA Exhibitors.

Simulcast Auction Sale Date: Saturday, July 17, 2021 at 1:00 p.m. MST

Information regarding the Rabbit Offering in the 2021 Junior Livestock Sale:

RABBITS will be offered as a **PREMIUM ONLY** disposition. The market rabbit show had to be cancelled this year due to the detection in Colorado of Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus type 2 (RHDV- 2). While RHDV-2 does NOT affect humans or domestic species other than rabbits, it is highly contagious and lethal among rabbits. As a result, in order to allow our Rabbit Exhibitors to participate in the Junior Market Sale this year, the Sale format will be **PREMIUM ONLY**. No project will be offered or transfer ownership. The winning bid is a donation from the Buyer to the Exhibitor.

BEEF, SHEEP, SWINE, and POULTRY will be offered as **TERMINAL ONLY.** All animals will be offered for sale and will transfer ownership to the highest paying bidder. Winning Buyer designates one of the following two options:

1. RETAIN FOR YOUR OWN USE/CUSTOM HARVEST

Buyer obtains ownership of the purchased animal and pays the full bid price to the El Paso County Junior Livestock Sale Committee. Buyer selects a Custom Meat Processor and the animal is transported to the selected Custom Meat Processor by the Sale Committee. Only Custom Meat Processors on the predefined list included in the Sale Catalog are allowed. Buyer contacts the selected Custom Meat Processor on the Monday following the Sale and provides cutting instructions for the meat. The Buyer is responsible for paying the processing cost to the custom processor when the meat is picked up.

The example provided below is for illustration and estimation purposes only based on the purchase of a market beef.

FORMULA:

Buyer's Bid Price (Full Price)

- (+) Processing Cost
- (x) Carcass Weight
- (=) Total Freezer Price to Buyer

EXAMPLE:

 1,300 lb. Steer @ Bid Price of:
 \$3,600

 (+) Processing (\$.87/LB x 815 lbs. + Harvest Charge \$85):
 \$794

 (=) Total Freezer Price:
 \$4,394

(Total cost of \$4,394 divided by Hanging Weight of 815 lbs. = \$5.39 per pound for all cuts of meat)

2. BUYBACK

The buyer is obligated to pay only for the difference between the market price and the full bid price (your bid). The Sale Committee will buy back the animal at market price. The buyer pays only the difference to the Sale Committee; **NO** other arrangements are necessary. The example provided below is for illustration and estimation purposes only:

FORMULA:

Buyer's Bid Price (Full Price)

(-) Buyback Amount (Market Price x Weight)

(=) Net Cost to Buyer

EXAMPLE:

1,300 lb. Steer @ Bid Price of: \$3,600 (-) Buyback Amount (Market Price x Weight: 1,300 @ \$1.00) \$1,300 (=) Net Cost to Buyer \$2,300

ADD-ON OPTION – An additional way to participate

Add-ons are straight donations to the exhibitors and no purchase is necessary. The opportunity to participate as an Add-On contributor will be open from Saturday, July 17, 2021 at 1:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. Tuesday, July 20, 2021 on the StockShowAuctions.com online platform.

If you are unable to purchase an animal, the "Add-on" option offers an opportunity provide support to the exhibitors. If you choose this option, you can add a set dollar amount to a specific or multiple exhibitor's animal.

For the 2021 Junior Livestock Sale, it is highly recommended that Add-On contributions be conducted through the online sale platform at www.StockShowAuctions.com.

Add- On contributions can also be completed at the live auction by completing an "Add On" form obtained at the Buyer registration or settlement table. Please include tag number, exhibitor name, and Add On amount you wish to contribute.

TAX DEDUCTIBLE EXPENSE:

Buyer's bid amounts over the market price is a tax deductible expense in most cases.

TERMS OF SALE:

Payment for purchases can be made by personal/business check, cash, debit or credit card at any time during the sale or at the conclusion thereof. Buyers of multiple animals will be given a summary and a combined total of their purchases. There will be a 3.9% convenience fee assessed on debit/credit card payments.

In addition, electronic invoices will be emailed at the conclusion of the Add-On portion of the Sale on Tuesday, July 20, 2021.

In order to promptly remit payments to our exhibitor, we appreciate payments within 24 hours of the Sale or receipt of the invoice. Any requests for other payment arrangements should be directed to Sale Manager, Patty Woodard at (719)439-2010 or email at epcojrlivestocksalecommittee@gmail.com.

PROTEIN FOR HELPING OTHERS (P4-HO) PROGRAM

The United States continues to be one of the wealthiest and most prosperous countries in the world. In Colorado, El Paso County ranks 10th in per capita income. Although America continues to prosper, food insecurity continues to be a serious concern with many implications for nutrition and health. Food insecurity affects cognitive development, behavioral and psychosocial dysfunction and overall health. Subsequently, the inability to purchase enough nutritious food adversely contributes to poor health effects.

For Food Banks, meat (protein) continues to be the most in demand food item, with unfortunately one of the highest costs to obtain. As a result, devising a means to supply donated meat helps address the food insecurity needs of the local community.

Service and community development is a major component of the 4-H program. By connecting youth members to the community, it allows them to make an impact in people's lives. In addition, community service provides transformational experience, which contributes to the development of contributing members of society.

As a result, the **Protein 4 Helping Others (P4-HO) program** has been developed to bring together corporate and individual sponsors, Colorado State University Extension, 4-H Youth, the El Paso County Junior Livestock Sale Committee, and the Colorado Springs Rescue Mission to provide for the implementation of the following objectives.

- 1. Serve as a model of service for 4-H youth involved in Junior Livestock projects.
- 2. Supply a much needed protein source to the hungry at the Springs Rescue Mission.
- 3. Provide an avenue for corporations, small business or philanthropist to fund both 4-H Youth and support the Springs Rescue Mission.
- 4. All groups and individuals who participate will be contributing to developing and improving the El Paso County Community.

P4-HO Program Methodology:

- 1. Sponsored funds will be used to cover the market price (floor) for those animals designated for buy-back during the Junior Livestock Sale at the El Paso County Fair and the associated processing fees.
- 2. The meat will then be donated to the Springs Rescue Mission.
- 3. The 4-H members will see that their food products went directly into the local food chain and supported the less fortunate in our community.
- 4. Donations/sponsorships will be tax deductible.

The P4-HO Program is a collaboration between Colorado State University Extension 4-H and the El Paso County Junior Livestock Sale to benefit the Springs Rescue Mission by providing whole-some protein sources that will strengthen our community.
