Description

I am 17 years old, and I would like to further my practice of responsibility and learning how to raise and make a profit from an animal and build these skills to help me in the future as I wish to attend a four year college in Texas in my future.

Here are a few things you should know about me. I am very dedicated to school. I maintain above a 4.0 GPA. I compete in year-round competitive riding where I am constantly learning life skills and so much more about horses. I started riding horses when I was about 3 years old, and I am now a part of the West Coast Reining Horse Association (WCRHA) as a youth rider. I started rening (which is a type of competition in riding horses) in 2016 with Hanson Performance Horses, and I plan to continue this in my future. I have shown in many places throughout the United states such as Idaho and Oklahoma.. The horse I currently have is 4 years old so it is always a learning experience. I participate in many of the youth meetings, fundraisers, and many other events held by the youth members for West Coast Reining Horse Association. I am very passionate about horses and riding, because it has been around me my whole life.

Recently I have taken upon a job to better my experience within the community and around animals. I started working for a close friend of my mom's in September. I clean stalls, fill up waters, tidy the barn, and make sure all the horses are fed at my bosses barn in Acampo. I provide my bss with any assistance she asks for like how I accompany her when she rides her 3 year old warmblood by riding one of her ranch horses. It is a great experience working and understanding the value of money plus I am helping make someone else's life easier.

This year I am raising a Yorkshire sow as my SAE project for Lodi FFA. I purchased her from Paul Fernandez, a breeder out of Ceres, CA, on February 6 of this year. She was born in December of 2020. I named my pig Blueberry, because of her unique light blue eyes. She is very friendly, and loves to root in the soil when I work with her around the yard for showmanship. SShe has a very straight and muscular back with a great ham, and I work with her on a weekly basis to keep her muscles defined. She has been gaining about one pound per day and should weigh about 265 pounds by Agfest. Raising Blueberry has been an exciting, challenging and big learning experience for me, due to pigs intelligence level being so high. I have learned to be much more responsible and patient as these animals do test your patience.

This year AGfest is split into different days when the animals are shown and sold based on species due to Covid regulations. The San Joaquin County Agfest will be held for showing market and showmanship for three days in the swine unit. The San Joaquin County Fair has made the decision to allow the sale to be live/simulcast auction meaning you will be able to attend the sale on June 19th to purchase an animal or participate remotely.
