Having market swine is a big responsibility, but I enjoy watching them grow and then showing them every year. With the money that I make from my project I am saving for college, and I invest money back into my project so that every year my project grows in size and scope. 6 years ago, my parents had to fund my project which was 2 pigs and now I finance my project which consists of 4 pigs. This year I am taking care of 7 pigs, as I leased out some of my space to a fellow 4-Her so that she could experience the joy of raising pigs. Before I age out, I would love to breed a gilt and raise a litter of my own.
