I have fallen in love with this sport and decided that I was going to play it throughout my 12 years in school. When I was born, I was diagnosed with cystic

fibrosis also called Cf, it is lung disease that builds up mucus in your lungs and you also cant digest your own food, the doctors said that I should not be near dust or swamp coolers but that's kind of hard when you show livestock, so instead of the swamp cooler I have big Fans above my steers and little fans above my pigs. To make sure it stays cool in there I also wet the barn floor down. I also wet the pigs and mist the steers. And when it comes to dust and cleaning pens, I will have someone help me and if it gets too dusty, I will step out the barn for a little and do something else outside of the barn. now that you know a little about me let's move on to my animals!!!

This year I have 2 show steers, 1 pig, and 5 pygmy goats. I have shown steer for the past 4 years, steers are my favorite animal to show, my first year ever showing cattle I had a mini that I had named mini, mini was my best friend and hated my parents so I had to learn a lot on my own with a little help walking and learning how to rinse and wash, but then I went into full grown calf's, I love show calf's and don't know what I would do without them. this year I have 2 market steers named Duke and Ace, Duke is going to be around 1400 pounds at fair and ace will be around 1200 pounds to 1300 at fair, Duke is going to be a slick sheer calf which means I will shave his hair off before fair, but that's just because he does not have a lot of hair when he was born. Duke is a big steer but very friendly. He loves being washed and dried because it's like a massage for him. Ace does not like the wash rack and he will kick and move around a lot he just does groomed, as much but ace loves to walk on a halter he will walk anywhere with you no matter what. Both steers are getting 48 pounds morning and night of high noon steer feed, fresh water and hay every day, they also get rinsed or washed every day, but as it gets closer to fair it will be 2 times a day, both my steers also get washed every Sunday is I don't do it Sunday I do it Thursday. My steers stand tied in a barn with 2 big fans on them every day after getting rinsed so they can cool off and just stranded tied I will let them go after a few hours. I would change a few things about my steers, but I think they are still nice, and I will have a fun year at fair this year
